
Art Activities

Art Activity 1 - Design your own Baby Turtle



This activity is complimented by **worksheet 1**, designing and creating your very own baby turtle.

To start, print out **worksheet 1** (template of turtlehead and flippers) to use for the activity.


Art Activity 2 - Design your own Turtle Habitat



This activity is complimented by worksheet 2, designing and creating a turtle habitat for your baby turtle made in Art Activity 1.

To start, print out **worksheet 2** (a template of sea animals and seaweed) to use for this activity.

Activity 1 - Make your own baby turtle



You will need:

An empty egg carton

Recycled paper and cardboard (old cereal and cracker boxes work well)

Paints, coloured pencils, and/or crayons

Scissors

Sticky tape

Glue

Paintbrushes and paint palette (An old recycled plate works wonders)





Activity 1 - Make your own baby turtle

Instructions

- 1. Holding the egg carton, carefully cut out one of the egg carton holders. This will be the shell of your baby turtle.
- 2. Place it down (pointy bit facing up) to see if the egg holder stands straight. Feel free to straighten up the bottom so the egg holder stands straight.
- 3. Paint and decorate the turtle shell to make your turtle look fabulous.
- 4. Using worksheet 7, follow the instructions to colour in your turtle's head, flippers, tail and shell shapes.










Activity 1 - Make your own baby turtle

Instructions continued...

- 5. When the paint is dry, carefully cut out your turtle head, flippers, tail and shell shapes.
- 6. Place glue on the back of your painted turtle's head and then fold in half. You should now have a double sided turtle head.
- 7. Paint and decorate the turtle shell to make your turtle look fabulous.
- 8. Attach the flippers, tail and head to the shell using sticky tape or glue.

Well done! You have now created a gorgeous baby turtle. Would you like to create a habitat for your turtle to live in? Go to **Art Activity 2 - Design your Own Turtle Habitat.**










Little Pago Art Activity - Worksheet 1

Template - Make your own baby turtle

- 1. Colour, paint and decorate the baby turtle's head, flippers, tail and shapes for it's shell.
- 2. Cut out each shape on the dotted lines.
- 3. Fold the turtle's head on the dark grey dotted line so you have a double sided turtle head.



Activity 2 - Make your own Turtle Habitat



You will need:

An empty egg carton
An empty cereal box
Paints, brushes and paint palette (you can use an old plate or container lid)
Coloured pencils and/or crayons
Glue and scissors




Activity 2 - Make your own Turtle Habitat


Instructions

- 1. Start by standing your cereal box up the right way. Cut off the top four flaps of the box. Then cut off the front of the box (this is the part showing you the name and picture of your cereal).
- 2. Paint the inside of your box to look like the ocean. Once your box is dry, paint the three external edges of the box. (These are the outside sides of your box.)
- 3. Holding the egg carton, carefully cut out a row of four egg holders. This will be used for the sand at the bottom of the ocean
- 4. Paint your egg holder. Once the egg holder is dry, glue or sticky tape the egg holder to the bottom of your box. They should fit in snugly.

Activity 2 - Make your own Turtle Habitat

Instructions cont...

- 5. Using worksheet 9, colour in your sea animals and seaweed. You can use paint, coloured pencils or crayons.
- 6. Cut out your sea animals and seaweed on the dotted lines provided.
- 7. Stick the sea animals and seaweed onto the walls of your turtle habitat. If you created the baby turtle in **Art Activity 1**, you can place your baby turtle into their new home that you created. **Well done and enjoy!**
